What is a specialty pharmacy?

Express Scripts is the company that handles processing of prescription drugs for your health plan. CuraScript fills the specialty drug prescriptions for Express Scripts. Specialty drugs are those drugs that come in different forms including oral (i.e., drugs taken by mouth, like pills or liquids) but are often injected, infused or inhaled. They most often need special storage and handling, need clinical monitoring, cost a lot of money and are given to a patient by a doctor or a nurse. If you use a specialty drug, our specialty pharmacy will send your drug to your home or doctor's office.

You don't have to manage your health problem alone. Our team of experts is here to help. They can work with you to help make sure your care always goes smoothly and safely.

- **Pharmacists:** The pharmacists are experts in medication management. They can tell you what to expect when you start a new treatment or if your prescription changes. If you have questions about how the drug you're taking works, what the side effects are or if there's a chance of any interactions with other drugs you're taking, the pharmacists can help. Pharmacists are on hand for urgent questions after normal business hours, too.
- **Nurses:** The nurses care about you and help track your treatment. They can help you manage side effects and help you to keep taking your medicines exactly as your doctor wants you to.

- **Patient Care Advocates:** Whether you need a refill of the drug you're taking or you just want some help with your health coverage, patient care advocates are here to help.
